This past year was an important one for The HEAL Project. We tackled big questions about the work we do, how we do it and where we're going. We've distilled valuable information from our conversations that will continue to influence our strategic direction for years to come. It's remarkable what happens when you expand your thinking beyond what you've always done to what you could possibly do. We're grateful to all of you who have contributed to this process and partnered with us to help teach kids where their food comes from and why it matters.

With your support, The HEAL Project accomplished a lot last year. Here are just a few highlights we'd like to share with you.

#### The HEAL Project's TOP TEN

- 1. Taught 939 hours of food systems education to 3,549 students
- 2. Purchased a tractor, increasing our production by 25% in the first season
- 3. Constructed a second outdoor classroom on the farm to double our capacity for hosting students
- 4. Renovated Farallone View Elementary School's outdoor classroom and added an outdoor "kitchen"
- 5. Relocated and rebuilt the garden at Hatch Elementary School to accommodate the school renovation construction
- 6. Updated our Mission, Vision and Values
- 7. Joined the San Mateo County Food Systems Alliance
- 8. Launched a new website
- 9. Won the inaugural Innovative Award at the Mel Mello Farm Day Luncheon for our work with young students
- 10. Became a member of ChangeScale, a network of environmental educators






